It's been over a year since I've become Mayor of Minoa and the time has gone by quickly. It is certainly a pleasure to serve our great residents and I am enjoying my first year in office as your Mayor.

I'm proud that in my first year, the Village of Minoa has become the first municipality in CNY to be named a Clean Energy Community by the State, which allows us to receive a \$100,000 NYS Energy Research Development Authority (NYSERDA) grant to go towards a clean energy project. I am really proud of the entire village staff and their work in making Minoa a state-wide leader in green technology. To achieve this goal, we had to complete 4 out of 10 high impact items that involved converting our 193 street lights to energy efficient LED lights. We have also completed adopting a benchmark policy that reports the energy use of our municipal buildings, deploying alternative fuel vehicles and adopting a unified solar permit.

We have just finished our 2017-2018 village budget and I am happy to report that village taxes will stay the same.

We are currently working towards becoming involved in the Community Choice Aggregation Program. CCA allows local governments a model for shared energy purchasing, which can lower energy costs for residents in their municipality.

With our Cleanwater Educational Research Facility (CERF) we are able to provide services to other municipalities that do not have the resources to complete themselves. Minoa can contract with them for these services and increase village revenue. We are always looking for ways to bring more revenue into the village. With the current climate and talk of merging government, I think it is important to show that a small village is able to do these type of things.

I continue having open communication with all the residents of the Village of Minoa. "Pizza with the Mayor" held on the last Wednesday of every month at Trappers II has been a huge success. I've enjoyed meeting all of you who have come out to share your ideas, concerns and suggestions with me. I would also encourage everyone to attend our board meetings. Please keep your pets on a leash or in a carrier and keep them close to you. If possible bring your pets past rabies records. New York State Public Health Law requires that all puppies and kittens get their first rabies shot at three months of age. They also need to get a booster shot at one year old and then again every three years. Ferrets must get a shot every year.
