Every New Year I set new goals for the Village of Minoa and reflect on everything we accomplished the previous year. Last year we were very successful in obtaining over \$200,000 in grant money to help pay for upgrades to equipment and facilities. We received \$100,000 from NYSERDA (New York State Energy Research and Development Authority) to purchase energy efficient pumps and controls for our WTP (Wastewater Treatment Plant). We received \$50,000 from Senator DeFrancisco for upgrading the electrical and equipment for Lewis Park pole barn. We were also awarded \$50,000 from FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant for installation of a new vehicle exhaust system for Minoa Fire Station II.

Deputy Mayor John Champagne worked closely with me in securing the \$100,000 grant for energy efficient upgrades to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. John also works closely with me on all the village's policies and contracts.

Trustee Greg Rinaldi has worked diligently in evaluating our DPW vehicle replacement program and has come up with a plan that will save the village tens of thousands of dollars in vehicle and equipment procurement. Greg has also worked diligently with Minoa Farms developer to find a way to bring back interest and growth for that development.

Trustee John Abbott continues to work closely with the Minoa Fire and Ambulance departments as Fire Commissioner to find ways to save money without jeopardizing services. Trustee Abbott is an active and voting member of the Town of Manlius Police Committee and assisted in the hiring of new Police Chief Michael Crowell.

Trustee Eric Christensen is in charge of all the village celebrations and works very hard setting up and organizing events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Memorial Day Parade, Hope for Heather 5K and the Christmas Tree Lighting. The Village is fortunate to have knowledgeable, experienced and dedicated Trustees. I commend them for their devotion to the Village in addition to being employed full time. Serving as a village official is a part time job that requires a tremendous amount of time and dedication. The village board takes an average of 8 to 10 personal vacation days from their full time jobs to attend municipal meetings and conferences to further their education every year.

#### A Word from your Trustees

I am very grateful for the opportunity to serve as your Deputy Mayor. My municipal responsibilities include: Wastewater Treatment Plant, Cleanwater Education and Research Facility (CERF), Security Camera Systems, Critical Response Committee, NIMS Compliance Officer, Communications, Website, Employee Handbook and Emergency Disaster Preparedness Planner for WTP.

We have been able to complete some projects started at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, specifically the Green Innovation Grant Program (GIGP) grant project. The plant upgrades will help us move forward towards our goal of sustainability.

As Mayor Brazill mentioned in his article, the village has been award \$100,000 through a NYSERDA grant which we will use to purchase four new pumps so our wastewater plant will perform more efficiently and cost effective. The pumps are state of the art and we are the first to try this new technology that will enable the pump activity it to be remotely monitored.

We continue to host ESM students doing "hands on" research under the supervision of ESM teachers John and Pam Herrington. *The ESM school district* was successful in obtain*ing* a grant for the purchase a new greenhouse which is now located at the wastewater treatment plant and last fall the village board dedicated the new greenhouse to former mayor Richard Donovan and ESM Superintendent Dr. Donna DeSiato for their hard work in pursuing the funding for the new structure. Although the greenhouse is currently being used by the students for their research projects in the near future we hope to grow *annual* flowers which will eventually be planted in the village flower boxes and park landscaping. We were successful in growing a small crop of pumpkins last year which we donated to the seniors of the Golden Age Club.

I would like to congratulate WTP Operator Eric Cushing on passing his test to get a 2A wastewater plant operator license; he is currently working on his 3A operator license. In November of 2016 the village hired Joshua Marko as WTP Laborer. Josh will be attending classes this summer working towards his 2A wastewater plant operator's license. Both Eric and Josh are ESM graduates and are being trained to operate our facility which requires a series of college classes and *work* experience before they can even apply for the certification examinations.
